2025 High School State Meet Wrap Up

Crawfish Aquatics athletes had outstanding showings swimming for their schools at the 2025 Louisiana High School State Swimming Championship Meets, contested in Sulphur November 19-22. Fast swimming was displayed by all of our athletes and it was rewarding for coaches, parents and fans to see athletes from both of our locations excel, not only representing their schools but also Crawfish Aquatics.

Highlights

- First, the incredible number of best times showing continued improvement from our athletes. Swimmers are racing competitors for other schools (and other clubs) but also themselves and the clock. It is most impactful to see improvement regardless of where an individual finishes..
- The continuation of athletes achieving All American status. This is the twelfth straight year that we will have at least one Crawfish swimmer honored as a NISCA High School All American. Noah Vargas earned recognition in the 200 IM swimming a consideration time and an automatic time in the 100 breaststroke. Andi Clement earned All American consideration in both the 50 freestyle and 100 freestyle. Jamison Lange earned All American consideration in the 100 backstroke. We look forward to them being honored this summer time as an official All Americans when all states have completed their school swim seasons next summer.
- Third, the number of state championships earned by Crawfish Aquatics swimmers. Our athletes
 helped multiple teams to win state titles for their teams, relays and we had many individual
 champions.
- Fourth, the number of state records set by Crawfish Aquatics Swimmers. Our athletes set four individual and one relay state record for their respective divisions..

We are so proud of our athletes for their efforts and it was nice to see them reap rewards for what they sowed. We have seen the top end of high school swimming in our state continue to evolve and get faster and Crawfish Aquatics athletes continue to be stars and blazing the trail!

Samantha Johnston, Faith Kubricht and Lydia Talley all of Parkview Baptist each won two individual events and two relays and we also had 7th grader JJ Rush win the 50 freestyle for University. Faith was named Outstanding Female Swimmer of the Meet winning both relays, both individual events and even setting the D3 meet record in the 100 breaststroke and helping Coach Billy and the PBS Eagles finish as team runners up. Jack McConnell of Episcoal was the other winner in Division 3, winning the 100 breaststroke on the boys side.
